1. 다음을 듣고, 남자가 하는 말의 목적으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

M: Hello, students. This is your vice principal. Our school is preparing to launch a school newspaper. Before we publish our first issue, we need your help with an important part of the project. We are looking for a great name for the newspaper that reflects our school spirit. If you have a creative idea, please submit it by scanning the QR code on the notice board by next Friday. W: Hello, students. Last time, we talked about the importance of eating healthy food. Today, I want to talk about some foods that may look healthy at first, but are not actually good for you when you check the nutrition labels. First, let's look at light salad dressing. Even though it is marketed as healthy, it often contains surprisingly high levels of salt and sugar. Second, let's talk about nut bars. They often contain sweetened nuts or chocolate, so a small bar may have more calories than you expect. This might lead to unwanted weight gain. Third is wheat bread. Most wheat breads are not made with 100% whole grains, so they do not provide enough dietary fiber. Finally, let's talk about veggie chips. They are usually processed and fried, which removes much of their original nutrition. Although they may taste like vegetables, they do not offer the same health benefits. You should be careful not to be fooled by foods that only sound healthy.
