

Politics cannot be suppressed, whichever policy process is employed and however sensitive and respectful of differences it might be. In other words, there is no end to politics. It is wrong to think that proper institutions, knowledge, methods of consultation, or participatory mechanisms can make disagreement go away. Theories of all sorts promote the view that there are ways by which disagreement can be processed or managed so as to make it disappear. The assumption behind those theories is that disagreement is wrong and consensus is the desirable state of things. In fact, consensus \_\_\_\_\_\_ comes without some forms of subtle coercion and the absence of fear in expressing a disagreement is a source of genuine freedom. Debates cause disagreements



to evolve, often for the better, but a positively evolving debate does not have to equal a reduction in disagreement. The supression of disagreement should never be made into a goal in political deliberation. A defense is required against any suggestion that political disagreement is not the normal state of things.

# ※ 다음 글을 읽고 물음에 답하시오. (17–19) [각 3점]

Musk's mother was a model and his father was a monster. Born in Pretoria in 1971, Elon was prone to long silences and speed-reading the encyclopedia. When he was 12, he wrote the code for a video game called *Blastar*, which he sold to a computer magazine for \$500. "He was always different. He was my little genius boy," Maye Musk, tells TIME. "From the time he was 3, we used to call him that—Genius Boy."

His parents divorced when Musk was 9. After the divorce, Elon and brother Kimbal went to live with their father. Errol Musk was a brilliant engineer and entrepreneur; he was also, in Elon's telling, and "evil" man who tormented the boy psychologically in ways Musk still finds painful to discuss. Errol Musk told *Rolling Stone* he once shot and killed three armed robbers who broke into his home. In 2017, Errol later acknowledged, he fathered a child with his ex-stepdaughter, 42 years his junior. Musk has said he no longer has contact with his father.

School was nearly as bad as home for the precocious child. Vicious gangs of bullies targeted Musk relentlessly, at one point beating him so badly he was hospitalized, until he hit a growth spurt in high school and started punching back. Musk's maternal grandfather had moved from Canada to South Africa in 1950, arriving during the early years of apartheid. When Musk was 17, he made the opposite journey, in part to avoid the regim's military draft. He took off for Canada, enrolling at Queen's University in Ontario.

Musk later transferred to the University of Pennsylvania, from which he graduated with a



double major in physics and economics. Accepted to Stanford University's Ph.D. program, he moved to California but \_\_\_\_\_\_ after two days. Instead, Elon and Kimbal decided to get in on the nascent Internet boom. They rented a tiny office in Palo Alto, slept on the floor, showered at the YMCA, pirated an Internet line from a neighbor and lived on Jack in the Box. While Kimbal tried to drum up business, Elon wrote code nonstop.

As little as forty years ago, few people questioned the gender roles that had prevailed for centuries. The conventional wisdom was that a woman's place was in the home and that a man's main responsibility to his family was to put food on the table. After 1980s, however, a father's emotional involvement with his family also became more important. In addition to society's changing views of the role men play in relation to childcare, social scientists are also re-examining the contribution a father makes to his child's welfare and development. According to the research, fathers tend to be more playful, thus \_\_\_\_\_\_ children to develop in a different way emotionally and physically than child might under a mother's exclusive care.

Studies have also found that the presence of the father in the home can contribute to lower juvenile crime rates, a decrease in child poverty, and lower rates of teenage pregnancy. This scene describes a typical case of spontaneous human combustion(SHC), in which a human body is supposedly able to burst into flames and to burn to almost nothing entirely on its own. In most SHC cases, there are no witnesses to see how the person caught fire. In rare cases, the observer, who is often a friend or family member, tries to put out the fire. \_\_\_\_\_ the victim survives. Again, there is no clear outside cause \_\_\_\_\_\_ the blaze appears to start from within the victim's own body.

This phenomenon is actually nothing new. A 1763 book by Frenchman Jonas Dupont with the title *De Incendiis Corporis Humani Spontaneis* describes in detail a number of cases of SHC. A century later, Charles Dickens used SHC to kill off one of the characters in his novel *Bleak House*. A number of more recent unexplained deaths have helped to keep the theory SHC alive. One of the latest cases was of Michael Faherty, a 76-year-old man who was found burned to death in his home in Galway, Ireland, on 22 December 2010. Police arrived to find mostly ashes, with his head near an empty fireplace. The room was undamaged by the fire. After a thorough investigation, the coroner recorded Mr. Faherty's death as a case of "spontaneous human combustion."

We hold on to an idea that is secretly pleasing to us, but deep inside we might have some doubts as to its truth, and so we go an extra mile to convince ourselves—to believe in it with great vehemence and to loudly contradict anyone who challenges us. How can our idea not be true if it brings out in us such energy to defend it, we tell ourselves? This bias is revealed even more clearly in our relationship to leaders—if they express an opinion with heated words and gestures, colorful metaphors and entertaining anecdotes, and a deep well of conviction, it must mean they have examined the idea carefully to express it with such certainty. ## ※ 다음 글을 읽고 물음에 답하시오. (26-28) [각 5점]

A social group such as a clan may be represented by different symbols. A totemic animal may represent the clan, and representations of the animal are used to signify that clan. This is true of the Kwakiutl and other tribes of the Pacific coast of Canada, where the specific totemic animal of the group is painted on the facade of the house and carved on the totem pole standing before the house. These tribes are like many other



societies of the world in that personal names given to members of the group belong to the entire group. When a person dies, his or her name returns to the pool of names, to be used again when a child is born. In general, the clan as a social group may be associated with particular spirits, including spirits of clan ancestors, who are said to dwell in a specific location in the clan territory. The spirits and the territory represent the clan. Strangers crossing the territory, or hunting in it, are in danger from the spirits that protect it. In such a situation, where the land symbolizes the \_\_\_\_\_\_ of the social group (the clan) from mythical times to the present, the land could not be sold for money without destroying the identity of the group itself. Thus, food can stand as a symbol for the group, but so, too, can an animal, a painting, a carving, a name, or a territory.

Just as clans can be represented by a whole series of things such as totems, houses, and personal names, so too may an entire nation be represented by an array of symbols. The combat between symbolic animals—the eagle and the bear—was used by political cartoons to portray the conflict between the Unites States and the former Soviet Union.

Individuals in positions of authority are associated with particular objects that become symbols of the office they hold. Sometimes the object is something the officeholder wears, such as a crown, or imperial regalia, which the officeholder alone may put on. Sometimes the office holder carries a staff, wand, umbrella, or fly whisk. The curved staff of the Pharaoh of Egypt was the symbol of office, and so it is seen in the pictures of King Tutankhamen.

Communication between neurons (nerve cells) is complex-and one of the most vital processes in the human body. Where communication shuts down due to injury or disease, part of the body will cease to function. Neurons are called electro-excitable cells because they respond to electricity; (A) , ordinary communication among typical neurons is a matter of chemicals. Neurons are separated from each other by small spaces called synapses, in the manner of neighboring houses separated from each other by small strips of lawn. Imagine that one neighbor, the Sender, wants to communicate a simple message-such as "Wake up!"-to another, the Receiver. The Sender sends a messenger (a chemical) over to his neighbor's house. However, it's not good enough for the messenger to simply go there and start banging on the door. The Receiver is inside a bedroom far from the outside of the house and cannot receive any messages (B) the messages come to exactly the right place in exactly the right form. "Receiver" neurons require that messenger chemicals fit into special receptor spaces that can accommodate only those chemicals. So the Sender neighbor equips his messenger with a very specific key. The messenger goes to one very specific slot that accommodates the key, which, when turned, rings a bell. If all steps are followed properly, the key turns, a bell rings next to the Receiver neighbor's bed, and he wakes up.
